Mayor Lynn Rumley called the meeting to order.

Invocation: Clerk Chandler

Mayor led us all in the Pledge to the US Flag.

Commissioner Vogler has asked that the Town Ordinances that would help keep properties looking better be expanded and improved. The Code Enforcement officer is already doing work in this area to propose language that would handle the request. The Mayor said she and George Madeja have some differences of opinions on what constitutes a violation. Commissioner Vogler said they needed to have George here to give his opinion. The Board can debate his findings later. Commissioner Daywalt says we continue to have the same people over and over violating the same ordinances. The Board asked that the Code Enforcement Officer continue his research into strengthening ordinances on these issues. The Board will set an early July called meeting to discuss these Ordinances. The Mayor suggested that the Board start working on these problems in the first days of July, after the Budget is approved. The Board agreedr.

The Clerk passed out a Budget Worksheet to each elected official. All departments turned in their proposed Expenses and the Clerk had all the projected Revenues. The Clerk went over various procedures of how Revenues were figured. He went over each line item in Expenses.
