

**Regular Meeting**

Minutes

In attendance were Mayor Lynn Rumley, Commissioners Jean Snead, Brad Waller, Tommy Daywalt, Scott Vogler and Town Clerk John Chandler

Mayor Lynn Rumley called the meeting to order.

Invocation: Clerk Chandler

Mayor led us all in the Pledge to the US Flag.

Motion made by Commissioner Snead to adopt the Agenda, which includes the Consent Agenda.

Seconded by Commissioner Daywalt

Vote was unanimous.

**Public Comment:** There was no public comment.

Motion made by Commissioner Daywalt to extend the Moratorium on Fences until the day after the next meeting in October.

Seconded by Commissioner Snead.

The Mayor spoke on the new ordinances that were passed at the last meeting. Code Enforcement officer George Madeja said he has already been citing people on some of them.

The Board wants to help inform the citizens of these new ordinances.

Conversation shifted to asking Madeja how he road around town and what schedule he used when looking for violations.

The mayor questioned the report that Code Enforcement was giving out, and suggested some changes. She asked Madeja if he needed any help working on a decent report form. Madeja said he and Mark Schambach will continue to make the report look another way if that is what was wanted. He said he began with a very detailed report when he first started, but some of the Town Board did not like it.

Mayor Rumley said she would like to see the following things on the report: Name of violator, was it still open or closed, the name of the owner, address of the property, type of violation (grass or trash). Commissioner Daywalt said that is what is on the current violation log report except for the person's name.

The Mayor asked that the report show how many violations have been issued to the same person. She said the current report was just fine with her and nothing more was needed. She asked that the violations be indexed by property address and then one by date. By using the address line it can be seen as to repeats. She asked the Board if they were also interested in repeat offenders. Most commented yes.

John Chandler was selected to take on the task of coming up with a letter to the citizens, that would make an awareness of new and revised ordinances.
