

**Regular Meeting**  
Town of Cooleemee  
February 18, 2019 6:00 pm  
Minutes

In attendance were Mayor Steve Corriher, Commissioners: Don Cover, Andy Reavis, Jessica Almond, Commissioner KC Smith was an excused absence. Clerk had retired.

Mayor Steve Corriher called the meeting to order.

Invocation: Commissioner Don Cover

Pledge to the US Flag led by The Mayor

Visitors were welcomed.

Mayor made note that KC Smith was absent tonight following a surgery, however a quorum was met by the remaining board.

Motion made by Commissioner Almond to adopt the agenda which includes the Consent Agenda with the Financial Report and minutes from January 21, 2019 regular, and January 28, 2019 Called Meetings. Seconded by Commissioner Cover, motion carried (3-0)

No one signed up for public comment.

Jane Blue, the new Davie County Librarian came to introduce herself to the board and the town, speaking of ideas and possibilities moving forward with the Cooleemee Branch. Asked if anyone would like to be or know someone would like to a representative on the library board for the county from Cooleemee area. Their meetings being held quarterly next being March 21, 2019 at 4 pm. She also spoke on an upcoming seminar on working with low income families and perhaps things that can be done for those.

Bob Scofield, with Cardinal Innovations Healthcare came to speak to the board about different services offered at their facility located in Mocksville at 142 Gaither St. (old Credit Union). They offer free services to all but try to help in other areas of health. Would be available to set up something in the Cooleemee area if ever requested and folks weren't able to make it to Mocksville for certain things that they provide. Pamphlets are available at Town Hall or see the Mayor or a Commissioner.

Guard Railing has been a topic of discussion at dead end roads for some time to aid in stopping of unnecessary traffic particularly on Joyner St to get to Dollar General a back way. Many attempts had been made and the town has been told repeatedly we were top of list, still with no work made. One final attempt to contact those folks and give them till months end to complete work or the town must go on to someone else or look at other options.

Brandon Emory gave his monthly update to the board several properties have been abated, some still in need of work, some we have all noticed they have started trying to comply. There are a few further action is going to have to be taken to get them moving but that process has started.

Motion made by Commissioner Almond to repost Clerk/Finance Officer position, there is still one or 2 person of interest in the position the Mayor is going to reach out to those but no permanent replacement has been found just yet.

Motion made by Commissioner Almond to allow A&E Washing to properly clean the tennis courts for \$875.00, so we can possibly add pickleball lines in the future. Seconded by Commissioner Cover. Mayor explained that this company is in hopes of instead of simply power washing the surface, that adding a detergent to the court and rinsing would hopefully spare the paint that was added in 2011. Motion carried (3-0)

Mayor reminded all that budget is approaching and all items should be ready for viewing at our April Meeting so submitted by April 12, 2019 for that purpose. Police, Recreation, Code Enforcement, have been submitted already.

Motion made by Commissioner Reavis to adjourn the meeting, Seconded by Commissioner Almond motion carried (3-0)
